Hosta prefer partial to full shade. Here in Zone 7, even those that can "take some sun" will only take some morning sun; later sun is too hot and their leaf edges will burn. With some sun they will need more moisture. All hosta appreciate consistent moisture for best appearance. \*Plants will typically grow larger in northern regions.
